Elegant mantel clock in finely chased bronze with mercury gilding, illustrating the refined taste of the Restauration period for allegorical subjects inspired by education and the arts. Nicknamed "The Library", this model features two young readers seated on either side of a substantial piece of furniture lined with books. This composition symbolizes study, the transmission of knowledge and intellectual awakening from childhood. The delicate treatment of the faces, the naturalistic rendering of the drapery and the richness of the decoration testify to the quality of execution of this work. The circular dial with Roman numerals is integrated into a stylized bookcase whose shelves are filled with carefully detailed books. The whole rests on a circular base adorned with garlands in relief, underlining the harmony and
