Description

A beautifully sculptural mid-century Italian commode, crafted in richly figured bubinga veneer and designed with softly curved ends that give the piece a refined, architectural presence. The chest features four generously proportioned drawers arranged in two side-by-side pairs, each fitted with elegant shell-form brass handles that add a subtle decorative flourish. The warm tones and distinctive grain of the bubinga are enhanced by the sleek inset glass top, finished in a soft beige hue -- a sophisticated surface detail that elevates the overall silhouette. Raised on gently tapered, serpentine legs with substantial brass sabots, the piece balances Italian glamour with clean mid-century modern restraint.
