Ottone Zorlini (Treviso 1891 - San Paolo 1967) - Landscape with lake and mountains. 23.5 x 30.5 cm (without frame) - 38.5 x 45 cm (with frame). Oil on cardboard, in wooden frame. Signed lower left: «O. Zorlini». Ottone Zorlini was a painter from Treviso active between Italy and Brazil during the first half of the twentieth century, trained within the Venetian tradition of plein air landscape painting. His work reflects a consistent focus on natural light and atmospheric rendering, with a loose, synthetic brushstroke close to the experiences of Lombard realism and the post-Impressionist Venetian school. The painting depicts a lakeside landscape with a low, rocky shore in the foreground, a wooded promontory to the left, and a broad expanse of water opening toward a distant mountain profile.

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The overcast sky, rendered with animated and layered brushstrokes, lends the scene a quietly atmospheric quality. The palette moves from earthy browns in the foreground to deep greens and muted blues in the water and distant hills. Condition report: Good state of conservation of the pictorial surface.
