Description

White glass porron used for drinking "à la régالade," 18th century. This porron, or "pourou," features a shape known as the "Carcassonne" style. It is held by its long, flared neck, which allows the contents to be aerated. Its slender spout facilitates drinking, and its flat, bulging base provides stability. Provenance : Spain The porron is an object of Spanish folk tradition. These "carafes" originated in the communities of the Aragon and Catalonia regions as early as the late 14th and early 15th centuries and became widely popular in the 17th and 18th centuries throughout Spain and later in the Languedoc region. The porron remains a powerful symbol, and its depiction generally affirms a Spanish or Catalan identity, as demonstrated by Salvador Dalí's *Man with a
