An applied insect on the shoulder of the vase adds a further naturalistic detail, typical of Japanese-inspired design.This aesthetic belongs to the celebrated period shaped by Edward C. Moore (1827-1891), the artistic force behind Tiffany's most innovative silver production. Under his direction, Tiffany & Co. became the leading American silversmith of the Aesthetic Movement, incorporating influences from Japanese and other Asian decorative traditions.Comparable Japanese-inspired Tiffany silver objects are held in the collections of the Metropolitan Museum of Art, New York; the Museum of Fine Arts, Boston; the Art Institute of Chicago; the Cooper Hewitt Smithsonian Design Museum, New York; and the Szépművészeti Múzeum, Budapest.Literature:Charles H.
