Description

Large and rare Japanese Satsuma earthenware bowl from the Meiji period (1868-1912), beautifully modelled in the form of a seashell. The interior is richly decorated with a finely hand-painted high-relief Japanese court scene, enhanced with gilt and colourful enamels. It depicts two men and a woman dressed in traditional kimonos. The decoration is set against the characteristic crackled ivory glaze typical of export-quality Satsuma ware. The exterior is sculpted with shells, snails, cockles and other marine elements in relief, creating an impressive three-dimensional effect while forming the support for the bowl. The highly original trompe-l'oeil design makes this an exceptional collector's object and a true cabinet of curiosities piece. Condition: a very small chip is present
