Nimcha saber with a European blade - North Africa, 17th century
An interesting European blade bearing a European maker's mark and an Arab maker's mark. An identical Arab hallmark is found on the blade of a nimcha saber from the Furusiyya collection (see photo). See *The Art of Knights in Islamic Lands*, collection of the Furusiyya Art Foundation. Page 76. The European hallmark, meanwhile, appears to be an Italian one, frequently found on blades from the 16th-17th centuries. See *Wallace Collection Catalogs, European Arms and Armor, Volume II*. Inventory numbers A495 and A502. Pp. 255 and 258. Steel guard with a front ring and a quillon. Handle made of bovine horn. Damage on one side. The assembly is solid. The guard has slight play. Length 99 cm Blade length 85.5 cm Weight
