### Description

- Seven porcelain dinner plates from the Haviland factory in Limoges, Dammouse pattern.- Inspired by Japanese prints and silks, the Dammouse collection celebrates floral beauty and Orientalism through delicate motifs enhanced with touches of gold, in the spirit of the Auteuil workshop.- The centerpiece of the table setting, the dinner plate showcases the main course and can be harmoniously arranged on the presentation plate.- Based on a reproduction of a drawing from an original plate executed by Albert Louis Dammouse, which is on display at the Haviland Museum in Limoges.- Albert Louis Dammouse (1848-1926) was a 19th-century French sculptor, painter, and ceramist. From 1882 to 1886, Albert Louis Dammouse worked under the direction of Ernest Chapelet, head of the Impressionist
