Its hilt is remarkably well-preserved and still retains its original wooden grip, now petrified--a feature rarely preserved on this type of archaeological object. The item is in good condition, completely stable, with a beautiful antique patina attesting to its authenticity and age. Total length: 30.4 cm.
