Description

Émile Gallé (Lorraine), Pair of Glazed Earthenware Teapots with Blue and White Decoration. A rare and attractive set comprising a teapot and its milk jug by Émile Gallé, the renowned glassmaker and ceramicist from Nancy, a major figure of French Art Nouveau. Made of glazed earthenware with blue decoration on a white background, these two pieces are distinguished by their elegant geometric handles and their Japonisme-inspired decoration reminiscent of Delftware. The teapot features an architectural landscape rendered in shades of blue, while the milk jug is adorned with stylized plant motifs. The finesse of the design, the balance of the forms, and the attention to detail testify to the quality of execution characteristic of late 19th-century creations. These works illustrate
