### Description

Rare and highly sought-after, this Brutalist lounge chair was designed by Sonja Wasseur Atelier and produced in the Netherlands in the 1970s. Created in a very limited edition in the designer's Amsterdam studio, this exceptional piece embodies the architectural boldness and artisanal craftsmanship that characterize Dutch Brutalist design. The armchair features a sturdy black-stained oak frame, paired with thick dark brown leather cushions, canvas support panels, and a distinctive adjustable backrest in chrome-plated steel. Designed to combine comfort and functionality, the backrest is adjustable in height and depth, offering multiple seating positions. Notable design details include exposed structural elements, bold geometric proportions, and the original headrest, held in

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place by decorative leather straps with buckles.

The authentic expression of the materials and the emphasis on structural components reflect the Brutalist philosophy that celebrates craftsmanship and construction. Both sculptural and comfortable, this armchair is a remarkable piece that will find its place in a design collection as well as in a contemporary interior or a refined living space.
