Description

A richly carved and openwork light oak console table. The symmetrical interlacing patterns, garlands of flowers, and plant motifs come together to form a beautiful carved shell at the center of the apron. The bases of the four generously curved legs are openwork and decorated with an acanthus leaf. The carved crossbar connecting the four legs features a generous central knob adorned with a large openwork shell and floral scrolls. This console table, with its balanced and finely executed motifs, features in several places the famous shell motif characteristic of the Regency period; it is topped with its original reinforced marble: Aleppo marble. This marble, predominantly yellow and composed of colored fragments, comes from the quarry at Tholonet, near
