David Teniers II, known as the Younger, born in Antwerp on December 15, 1610, and died in Brussels on April 25, 1690 (at age 79), was a Flemish painter, son of David Teniers the Elder and Dymphna de Wilde. The stepson of Jan Brueghel the Elder, known as "the Velvet Painter," whose daughter Anne he married in his first marriage, he was the father of the painter David Teniers III. He remarried in 1656 to Isabelle de Fren, with whom he had four children. He was the nephew of
