three-masted rig and high sterncastle, evoke the appearance of Dutch, English, and Spanish trading ships that dominated international maritime commerce during the early modern period. Particularly attractive is the decorative transom featuring a heraldic coat of arms framed by lions, lending the model a distinguished and historical character. While not representing a specific documented vessel, it closely resembles the style of merchant galleons and East India trading ships of the 17th century. Likely produced during the 20th century, this handsome model was created as a decorative collector's piece and remains an impressive display object for a library, study, yacht club, coastal residence, or maritime collection. The warm walnut tones, intricate rigging, and beautifully balanced design make it a striking example of traditional ship model craftsmanship.
