Description

A charming pair of glazed ceramic candlesticks created by Robert Picault in Vallauris in the 1960s. These pieces feature an original shape inspired by antique oil lamps, with a small side handle and an integrated saucer. The decoration, characteristic of the artist's style, combines geometric patterns and stylized spirals in a palette of turquoise greens, whites, and natural earth tones. Both decorative and functional, these candleholders perfectly exemplify the Mediterranean aesthetic for which the Vallauris workshops are renowned. A leading figure in 20th-century French ceramics, Robert Picault (1919-2000) settled in Vallauris in the late 1940s and played an active role in the postwar revival of ceramics. His work is distinguished by the influence of ancient Mediterranean art, Greek
