A stunning Cuval from Maras in Anatolia. Cuvals are large carrying bags used by nomadic peoples to store grain and transport it during their migrations. Each of these items bears the distinctive marks of its owners, which are directly linked to their geographic origin. Woven wool on wool. The weaving is as exquisite as the aesthetic appeal. Given the intended use of such items, these pieces are sturdy. Composed exclusively of plant-based dyes in perfect harmony, enhanced by the use of cotton (white patterns) that brings out the contrasts.
