Description

A very interesting seal with interchangeable dies. The seal is made of brass with a square cross-section and is entirely decorated with romantic motifs such as putti, ancient profiles, volutes, quiver birds, etc. The hollow handle reveals a small "drawer" that normally holds additional dies. Unfortunately, it is empty. A double-sided die is present: On one side, a bouquet of flowers and the inscription "J'attends". The other side bears the inscription "Te perdant je suis perdu" along with a ship tossed by the waves. This die is held in place by a small removable frame. Although rare, it is possible to find "orphan" dies to complete this beautiful object. 7.5 cm long 2.5 cm at its widest point 26.3 grams Very good condition. Minor signs of wear.
