Interpretation of the coat of arms (subject to alternative readings): Per gules and or In chief, a count's crown Two winged supporters, one on each side (divine right) On the dexter side, gules with a fess or. On the left side, Or, two red crests and three silver ears of wheat Condition: Coat of arms on canvas mounted on a stretcher frame, surrounded by a simple modern wooden molding.
