An elegant Empire-style mahogany armchair, resting on four saber-shaped legs at the back and tapered legs at the front, ending in claw feet. The armrests feature remarkable carved consoles in the shape of sphinxes or winged Egyptian female heads, an emblematic motif of the Egyptian-inspired style that developed during the First Empire. The curved waistband is punctuated by decorative gilt-bronze medallions. The slightly sloping backrest is framed by scroll-shaped uprights, and the piece as a whole maintains a beautiful harmony of proportions. The upholstery is covered with a neoclassical fabric featuring a
