### Description

Silver court sword from the Louis XVI era--18th century (1770-1780). Silver hilt, decorated with diamond-point motifs and a floral medallion. Oval pommel decorated with floral medallions and a riveted knob. Tang featuring two central medallions with floral decoration. Engraved joint arch with a central floral medallion. Engraved crossguard and donkey's foot, as well as the escutcheon featuring the same decoration. Hallmark on the lower ring of the tang: "Fermier Généraux," and a second hallmark on the ring of the double crossguard: "AC." Openwork double crossguard engraved on both the inner and outer sides with the same floral decoration as the entire mount. Triangular blade, 85 cm long. Sword without scabbard. Length: 101 cm. Blade width at the heel: 1.8 cm. Silver swords
