### Description

A very pretty small console table with a top in polychrome Boulle marquetry featuring tortoiseshell stained green and red, mother-of-pearl, and ebony, on a gilded copper background. With a distinctive shape, it features rich ornamentation of bronze elements, chiseled and retaining their original mercury gilding, depicting sea monsters; the bronze on the door depicts Poseidon and a muse, and is topped by a cupid bearing a coat of arms. The case is in good condition. The movement is functional and strikes on the hour and half-hour, it will require a pendulum and a winding key, both of which are missing. The hammer needs to be reattached. The plate is signed "Delorme à Paris". The console features beautiful bronze fittings, including an espagnolette, which has some minor gaps and
