This Avshar Anatolian kilim features a rich visual vocabulary typical of the Turkmen tribes of southern Anatolia. The motifs are not merely decorative; they convey messages related to protection, fertility, tribal identity, and daily life. The composition is organized along several vertical axes. This symbolizes order, the balance of the world, and family harmony. The central medallion acts as a symbolic heart, sometimes interpreted as a sacred or protective space. Woven with wool over wool. The weave is extremely fine and refined. The piece is supple and lightweight. Exclusively plant-based dyes, deep and harmonious. Shades of burgundy, wine red, midnight blue, ecru, and olive green. Avshar kilims are known for their distinct geometric patterns, strong contrasts, and a certain graphic
