Porcelain plate from the Compagnie des Indes -- "Famille Rose," decorated with a flowered rock -- China, Qianlong period, 18th century Polychrome glazed porcelain. China, Qianlong period (1736-1795), mid-18th century. Diameter: 22.5 cm. Chinese porcelain plate with a "Famille Rose" design, more elaborate than a simple floral pattern. The center depicts a garden scene: a blue scholar's rock--a rock pierced with holes, a traditional Chinese motif associated with longevity--from which rise crimson peonies and flowering branches, near a small fence (the palisade painted in reddish-orange) set on a terrace. The rim is adorned with a scattering of individual flowers against a white background and edged with a thin brown border. The design is enhanced with touches of blue, green, and iron

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red.Key DetailsChinese porcelain from Jingdezhen produced for export to Europe in the 18th century ("East India Company"). The garden scene featuring a rock and peonies--more elaborately rendered than typical floral arrangements--captivates with its intimate composition; this makes it a unique piece, distinct from a simple serving plate.ConditionGood overall condition. There is a small chip and a hairline crack along the rim, visible but unobtrusive.
