Description

This piece from the Napoleon III period, crafted from blackened wood, is distinguished by delicate marquetry featuring brass fillets that form refined frames and graceful garlands surrounding a vase of flowers on top. Its lid, lined with a mirror on the inside, opens to reveal a compartmentalized interior designed for the careful organization of small objects. A belt-style drawer is adorned with a chiseled key. The piece rests on four tapered, fluted legs adorned with slender spindles. These legs are elegantly connected by a crossbar, giving the piece a harmonious silhouette and a charm typical of the Second Empire period, where the finesse of the cabinetmaking blends with the delicacy of the brass ornamentation.*****Period: Second half of the 19th centuryRestored in our cabinetmaking
