Original oil on canvas, in a contemporary 19th-century carved and gilded wooden frame. The painting depicts a street in an Arab city bustling with figures in traditional dress and a saddled camel, framed by a dilapidated wooden portico. In the background, beyond a horseshoe-shaped arch framing Moorish-Islamic ruins and architecture, a landscape unfolds featuring mountains and a body of water bathed in the golden light of late afternoon. The composition skillfully exploits the interplay of shadows and light reflections on the stone surfaces, linking the work to the mid-19th-century European Orientalist movement, influenced by travels in North Africa
