Charles-Henry Bizard, Portrait of a man wearing the ribbon of the Medal of Merit. Canvas dimensions: 46 x 55 cm. Charles-Henry Joseph Bizard (born in Roubaix on November 14, 1887; died in Lyon on November 1, 1954) was a French painter. A student of Pharaon de Winter and Eugène Deully, he was deaf from birth, a member of the *Société des Artistes Français*, and an *Officier d'Académie*; he died in an accident in Lyon. He exhibited at the *Salon des Artistes Français* from 1925 to 1945, at the *Cercle des Beaux-Arts* in Madrid in 1928, and at the *Société des Beaux-Arts* in Nice and Roubaix.
