Description

Two-tiered dessert stand or display piece made of Vieux Paris porcelain. The base bears the monogram DF. Assembled with a threaded rod and nut. The gold trim is in very good condition. Bears the mark "Ed. Honoré Boul Poissonnière No. 4 in Paris / Manufacture in Champroux, Allier". Edouard Honoré began his career as a ceramics manufacturer in partnership with Dagoty between 1816 and 1820. In 1824, he acquired the Champroux factory in the Allier department to produce unglazed pieces, which were then sold in Paris on Boulevard Poissonnière.
