Description

In a state of preservation bordering on the miraculous, a superb Shirvan rug from the Caucasus. Azerbaijan. What I find remarkable about the composition of this piece is its perfect balance. The madder-red central field features six medallions arranged vertically. Each one contains four stylized floral motifs. These diamond shapes are surrounded by small indigo-blue motifs--ram's horns, symbols of strength and protection. Another notable feature can be found on the main borders that completely frame the field. They feature a green hue with small touches of yellow within it--a sort of shimmering bottle green. Woven and knotted with wool over wool. The pile is short, measuring only a few millimeters. This is one of the characteristics of antique Caucasian rugs. The quality of the

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hand-spun wool is also remarkable--soft, almost silky. It is this wool that allows the plant-based dyes to reveal their full depth, reflecting light and creating captivating visual effects.
