Description

Louis-Alexandre CABIÉ (Dol-de-Bretagne 1853 - Bordeaux 1939) Seaside near Toulon, 1918 Oil on panel H. 29.5 cm; W. 51 cm Signed lower right, dated. Located on the back Louis Cabié, a renowned artist in France--and particularly in the Bordeaux region--even during his lifetime, traveled throughout the greater southwest throughout his life. A student of Harpignies, whose passion for vegetation in the style of the Barbizon School is evident in his work, he continued to capture the simplicity of picturesque French landscapes until his death. Spectacular trees, forest atmospheres, places steeped in history, enchanting valleys, or even a landscape in its most unadorned state--he knew how to bring out its vital contrast. Around 1890, Cabié began spending time in southeastern France,

where he would later take up residence in Antibes. His first known works set along the Mediterranean coast were created in Martigues--in the canal-side town, either on the sea side or the Étang de Berre side. Our panel, painted in 1918, is one of the artist's most luminous works, which he set near Toulon. The exact location remains unclear. Luminous, colorful, and rich in detail, it captures the essence of the local landscape and fishing life. We are seeking any works or information related to the artist to complete his biography as well as a catalogue raisonné currently in progress.
