Jean de LESPINASSE (1896-1979) Rare Large Ceramic Vase, circa 1950-60 Magnificent large vase by Jean de Lespinasse decorated with a horseman in armor and horses in full tack, baluster-shaped ceramic vase with a brown glaze tinged with black and partially polychrome. Monogrammed "JdL" on the underside of the base and numbered "50." Very good overall condition Height: 40 cm Diameter: 20 cm at the widest point Jean De Lespinasse (1896-1979), who began producing ceramics in the late 1940s; his path crossed that of Roger Capron MADOURA, Georges Tardieu. His works were sold in luxury boutiques, initially on the Côte d'Azur, and later throughout France and internationally. The pieces are generally large, dynamic, and highly structured.
