A unique bottle made of orange-red clay, with a white engobe under a manganese-marbled glaze and a few green spots of copper oxide. Side handle. Small tubular spout, originating from the bottom on the inside. A rare glazed earthenware piece. I haven't been able to determine its origin, but I suspect it comes from the Southeast. Patches and cracks in the glaze. Good condition. Height: 9.2 cm Diameter: 8.5 cm Length: 11.5 cm (including the handle)
