Description

This Kurdish saddle bag (khorjin or mafrash) comes from the mountainous regions of western Persia, likely from Iranian Kurdistan, and dates from the 1910s-1920s. These bags were woven by nomadic Kurdish tribes to carry provisions and personal belongings during their seasonal migrations. The upper panel features a typical central geometric medallion with stylized floral motifs, while the striped central section served as the bag's expandable body. These tribal textiles are highly sought after by collectors of antique Oriental rugs and enthusiasts of ethnographic art for their authenticity, vibrant natural colors, and historical value. Kurdish bags are particularly prized for their bold geometric patterns and the quality of their weaving. They serve as a tangible testament to traditional

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nomadic life and have become sought-after decorative pieces in contemporary interiors, showcasing authentic tribal craftsmanship.
