Fragment of an architectural frieze in white marbleRoman art, 1st century A.D.An elegant carved fragment of fine-grained white marble, likely from a Roman-era architectural decoration--a frieze, entablature, or sarcophagus side panel. The front face preserves a bas-relief motif of fine craftsmanship, featuring a composition of radiating gadroons set within a curvilinear frame, surmounted by an arched molding and flanked by a quadrangular motif with incised lines. This ornamental vocabulary, characteristic of the Roman decorative repertoire, evokes the stylized shells and foliage motifs that adorned the grand sculpted ensembles of the Early Empire.The stone bears a uniform, aged patina in shades of beige and ochre, evidence of a long period buried underground. The eroded

edges and natural fractures lend the work the poignant character of an archaeological fragment, while the rough-hewn reverse side reveals the marble's crystalline texture and the marks of time. Mounted on a contemporary black metal base suitable for museum display, this fragment stands as an authentic testament to the refinement of Roman ornamental sculpture.
