Hammered copper and silver vase by Kakuhei Tamagawa (1901-1992), 5th-generation master of Gyokusendo. Comes with its original box signed by the artist. Japan, circa 1970, 25 x 18 x 7 cm. Gyokusendo, founded in 1816, is the only workshop in Tsubame, Niigata Prefecture--a city renowned for its local metalworking industry--to continue the traditional "tsuiki-doki" technique (hammered copper craftsmanship). This process involves hammering a single sheet of copper to create copper objects. The workshop's ability to apply a variety of colors to copper is a technique unique in the world. It produces copper objects of the highest quality and has customers all over the world.
