An imposing decorative vase with rich, historicist forms. The vase's body, with its rounded belly, is covered in a flowing multicolored enamel decoration in shades of brown, red, green, and gold, creating the so-called "lava glaze" effect. The neck and base are designed in the form of stylized architectural elements. The handles, with their strongly curved volute shape, blend into relief decorations depicting plant motifs. The sides feature female masks of classical beauty, with ornate hairstyles and jewelry. Manufacturer: Sarreguemines, France. Model: 2314. Period of manufacture: late 19th - early 20th century. 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localized scratches and small areas of glaze loss. Sarreguemines was one of France's leading earthenware manufacturers, in operation since the 18th century. In the 19th century, it became known for its production of decorative art ceramics, often inspired by historical styles and experiments with glazes.
