Description

A pair of decorative vases created by Charles-Émile Jonchery, a French Art Nouveau sculptor. The artist is known for his subtle rendering of the human form and for the harmonious combination of figurative motifs with the organic shapes of vases and furniture. The two vases are shaped like slender chalices with flowing curves, from which rise female figures in the round with sensual silhouettes and soft lines. The movement of the drapery and the models' poses reflect the era's characteristic fascination with nature, the rhythm of the waves, and the theme of feminine sensuality.
