Description

In the 1920s, the range of materials available for crafting luxurious walking sticks for the elegant gentleman was endless. Back then, it was unthinkable to go out without a cane, gloves, and a hat. Here, the choice fell on a very dark red, wavy shaft--perhaps mahogany or an exotic wood no longer commonly used today-- a handle made of contrasting horn of infinite lightness, and an openwork gold ferrule covering a thin ivory disc. The tip is made of brown horn. The assembly is executed to perfection. The gold ferrule has been inspected (it's difficult to get a clear photo of the hallmark). In very fine original condition
