In this seascape in oil on canvas, created in the finest traditions of European marine Romanticism of the second half of the 19th century, attributed to the brush of the renowned British painter William Thornbery (1847 - 1907), fishing sailing vessels are depicted, bravely withstanding the onslaught of coastal waves. Skilfully employing a complex colour palette, Thornbery reveals subtle nuances of illumination, animating the dynamic foreground of the painting and emphasising the expression and drama of the moment. And the pier depicted in the distance, together with the outlines of mountain peaks in the haze, lend the composition epic quality and scale. Every detail of the canvas, from the wind-taut sails to the swift flight of gulls over the water, is imbued with an allegorical celebration of human courage and

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fortitude in the face of majestic and formidable nature.
