This piece is part of the African tradition that draws on the forms and techniques of the famous Gallo-Roman sigillata pottery, particularly those from the workshops at La Graufesenque and Lezoux. It is inspired by the Dragendorff 14 type. The piece is in excellent overall condition, with only a small localized chip on the underside (see photograph).
