Description

A handwritten annotation at the bottom of the work indicates that this is a view of Pont de Montvert, a small town located in Occitanie. Signed "Constant Le Breton" in the lower right corner. Constant Le Breton (1895-1985) was a French painter, printmaker, and illustrator who initially trained under a shop-front painter in his native Loire region. After being drafted during World War I, he moved to Paris's Saint-Germain-des-Prés neighborhood, where he worked for theater set designers, illustrated books, and devoted himself to woodcut printing. Thanks to a grant from the Blumenthal Foundation, he gained recognition and broadened his repertoire, painting portraits as
