Description

A pair of walnut panels finely carved in high relief, adorned with marble inlays, likely originating from the doors of a Renaissance cabinet or a prestigious piece of furniture. Each panel is divided into three sections: an eagle with outstretched wings surmounting a marble plaque; a figurative scene carved to depict a crowned sovereign on one panel and a scene depicting Saint Anne, Mary, and the infant Jesus on the other, followed by a decoration of sphinxes in the lower section. The carving displays fine craftsmanship, with an antique patina and wear consistent with several centuries of existence. The original marble inlays contribute to the overall refinement of the piece. The proportions, the presence of the original rebates, and the construction suggest that these are antique door
