Depicted sitting, they feature white coats accented with hand-painted black spots, long drooping ears, and expressive eyes--characteristics typical of Victorian pottery. Iconic symbols of English ceramics, Staffordshire dogs were traditionally displayed in pairs on the mantelpieces of Victorian homes. Inspired by the King Charles Spaniel, a breed that was very popular in England at the time. In very good overall condition with slight signs of wear. A few minor imperfections in the glaze.
