Description

An 18th-century, c.1770, Chantilly porcelain cup and saucer in the blue sprig (à la brindille) pattern. Maker's marks: Underglaze blue horn marks to both cup and saucer. Incised "D" to the base of the saucer. Incised "Sou" and another incised mark (possibly a stylised "M") to the base of the cup. Measurements: Cup: 6.4 cm (2.5 in) high. Saucer: 12 cm (4.7 in) diameter. Notes: This set is delicately potted in soft-paste porcelain with high translucency. We have been unable to find another example of the shape, including in museum collections. Condition: In excellent original condition. Small brown firing mark to the side of the foot of the cup. A little light peppering to the interior of the cup. Some pinprick glaze pops to the saucer. Shipping: Free to UK, EU, Canada, Australia, Asia, USA, and most other

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
