Pair of oxblood-colored porcelain flasks with gilded chiseled bronze France, second half of the 19th century. A rare and elegant pair of decorative porcelain flasks with oxblood glaze--a deep, luminous red--adorned with a rich, finely chiseled and gilded bronze mount. The particularly harmonious proportions of these vials captivate with the softness of their lines: a generous body extends into a long, slender neck, creating a silhouette of great distinction. This elegance is highlighted by a gilded bronze floral mount, composed of gnarled branches, foliage, and finely chiseled buds. The stoppers, crowned with remarkable leafy fleurons, elegantly extend the verticality of the ensemble, while the openwork bases lend lightness and balance to the composition. The contrast between the intensity of

the oxblood glaze and the warm luster of the gilded bronze produces a particularly refined decorative effect, characteristic of high-quality French craftsmanship from the second half of the 19th century.
