Lost-wax bronze sculpture of a working horse grazing. With blinders on, we can assume that after a hard day's work in the fields, this horse is enjoying its meal. This bronze sculpture, with its lovely size and red-tinged medal patina, was cast using the lost-wax technique by Mario Pastori (square stamp on the base). A few minor traces of oxidation that do not affect the presentation. Signature on the rear base: Hubacher 1940A highly renowned Swiss sculptor.
