An important pair of 800-th solid silver vases, attributed to Italian craftsmanship, late 19th-early 20th century. This remarkable pair of 800-th solid silver vases perfectly illustrates the late 19th- and early 20th-century Italian taste for exuberant forms inspired by the Baroque repertoire. The strongly curved bodies are entirely crafted from repoussé silver, richly decorated with large acanthus leaves, shells, volutes, and finely chiseled plant motifs, creating a spectacular relief and demonstrating remarkable craftsmanship. Their dynamic silhouette, resting on a widely flared pedestal and ending in a wavy rim, gives them a particularly elegant decorative presence. The quality of the repoussé work, the depth of the reliefs, and the balance of the proportions attest to a work of exceptional

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craftsmanship. Both vases bear a Belgian hallmark certifying a fineness of 800 parts per thousand, though this does not indicate their place of manufacture. Given their style and craftsmanship, they are attributed to an Italian workshop. This significant pair is in perfect condition, with no restoration, which is particularly noteworthy for pieces of this size and decorative richness.
