A charming 19th-century oil on panel depicting a young shepherdess gently caressing a lamb under the peaceful gaze of a sheep, set within a sunlit pastoral landscape. The panel has been cradled on the reverse, a traditional reinforcement technique designed to minimize the natural movement of the wood. This

The painting is presented in a remarkable 18th-century carved and gilded wooden frame, whose beautiful aged patina perfectly enhances the composition.

François Boucher (1703-1770)

François Boucher was one of the greatest French painters of the 18th century and a leading figure of the Rococo movement. Appointed First Painter to King Louis XV and patronized by Madame de Pompadour, he excelled in pastoral, mythological, and fête galante scenes. His work is distinguished by luminous compositions, a delicate palette, and an unparalleled sense of grace. His idealized shepherdesses and enchanting landscapes remain among the most iconic images of 18th-century French painting.
