The painting reproduces the celebrated Portrait of Bindo Altoviti by Raphael (Urbino 1483 - Rome 1520), preserved at the National Gallery of Art, Washington. Bindo Altoviti, a wealthy Florentine banker and prominent Renaissance patron, is among the most celebrated subjects of Raphael's Roman period, dateable to around 1515 and cited by Vasari in the *Vite*. The young man is depicted in three-quarter view, his head turned toward the viewer, with long blond hair, a black beret, and a dark cloak against a deep green background. The left hand raised to the shoulder completes the figure with ease. This is a nineteenth-century copy of good executive quality, faithfully

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reproducing the composition of the original with careful rendering of flesh tones and drapery.
