Of typical Georgian form, the cupboard stands on its original bracket feet and retains its original back boards, boasting a superb, untouched color and rich patina throughout. The molded oak-paneled doors are finely detailed with satinwood and ebony

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stringing and constructed using traditional pin-joint construction, reflecting the meticulous craftsmanship of the period. A well-proportioned molded cornice with an attractive ogee profile crowns the piece, giving it a truly architectural presence. The cupboard can be separated into two sections for ease of transport and installation. Recently cleaned and wax-polished in our workshops, it is offered in excellent condition and ready for display.
