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Heavy Thrusting Dagger From The 16th-17th Centuries

Description

Heavy thrusting dagger from the 16th-17th centuries. Blade made entirely of filigree iron, with slightly concave sides. Forged iron hilt, with a solid, button-shaped pommel made of iron, serving as a counterweight to the blade. Guard with two straight, flared quillons. Straight, rigid, and very tapered blade, designed primarily for thrusting (the estoc) to penetrate clothing or gaps in armor. The markings visible on the flat/groove of the blade are a very characteristic feature of bladed weapons manufactured in Europe between the late 16th and 17th centuries. The engraving features stylized cursive letters. These are armorer's marks or votive inscriptions. Italian work, circa 1600. Total length: 40 cm. The steel shows slight oxidation spots and a uniform gray patina, characteristic of such an ancient and very
